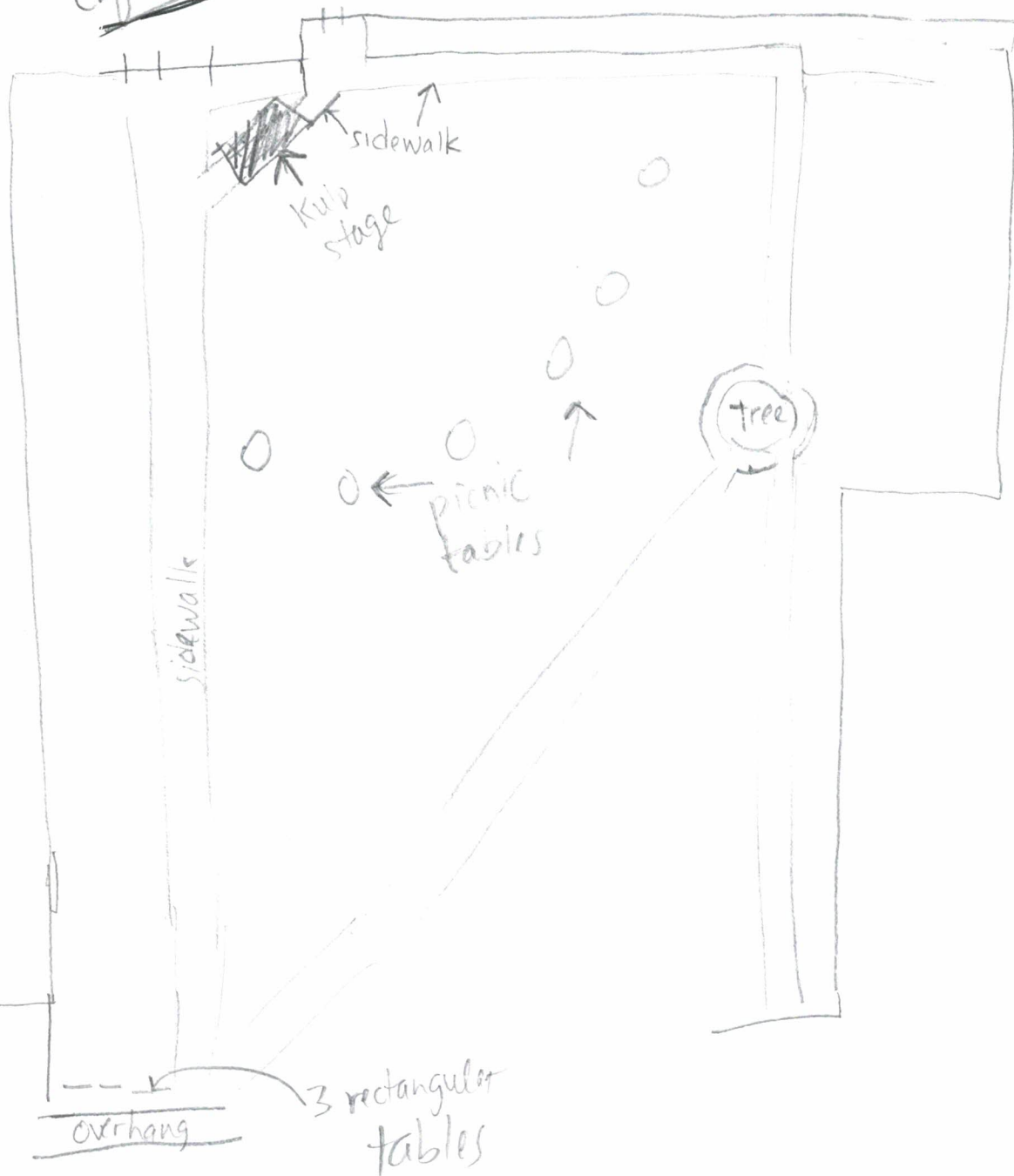

Dear College Counselor,

As the next admission cycle begins, we want to reaffirm one of USC's most deeply held values, which is central to our mission: our commitment to **increasing access** to world-class higher education for talented students, regardless of their economic, social or family circumstances.

Over the years, USC has applied more resources and innovative thinking to the challenges of finding and supporting accomplished but disadvantaged students who might otherwise miss out. As a result:

- Admission to USC continues to be strictly "need-blind," meaning that a family's ability to pay will not affect an admission decision.
- Students are supported by one of the most robust financial aid programs in the U.S. Nearly two-thirds of all undergraduates receive some form of financial aid, most of that comprising gift aid — funds that do not need to be repaid.
- USC stands out from other private research institutions in admitting — and graduating — significantly higher numbers of low-income students (as defined by Pell Grant eligibility), as well as transfer students and first-generation college-goers.
- As highlighted in a recent *Los Angeles Times* article, USC admits and enrolls more transfer students than other elite, private universities. A significant proportion of transfer students are first-generation college-goers and many are supported by the university's grants for community college transfers. These efforts have also extended into groundbreaking programs for the elementary, middle and high schools located in our campus neighborhoods, with results that have captured the attention of educators and policy-makers around the country. Accordingly, I'm pleased to share the enclosed reprint of a recent article in the *New York Times* highlighting one of our flagship programs, the **Neighborhood Academic Initiative**, which provides full scholarships to underserved students who complete the program and meet USC's admission criteria.

Now that we have concluded the Freshman Orientation events for this year's highly accomplished entering class, we appreciate more than ever the important work you do in preparing students for the next level of their education. We have included a poster that we hope will help inspire your students to consider USC.
